ke Choyse of Such and so many Weell qualified Men for
Deputyes to Seet in General Assembly according to
the Govenours Warrat and to Meet at the Colony
house at Newport the 26 day of this Instant or the
27 Instant if the Weather Should prevent Meeting
ye day above Said, and Act in any other town-
Business as may be thought Needfull, here of fail you
not as you Will Answare the Contrary at your Perils. Given
under My hand and Seale in Portsmouth this Eight day
of the Ninth Month Called November and in ye tenth year
of his Majes. Reign George King Over Great Brittain &c
