

The following document is a response to an inquest into the death of a Native American boy named Robin Sonkanawash (3/24/1724):

Portsmouth March the twenty fourth day of 1724

We whose name are hereunto subscribed being engaged according to law by Justice Freeborn Coroner upon a grand Inquest to view the body of an Indian boy that was found dead by the Name of Robin Sonkanawash & we have-ing [sic] diligently searched & enquired we find by an accident he was drowned.
