

Bee it knowne unto all whome It may Concerne That I Grace Bayly late wife and now widdow to the late Deceased William Bayly of the Towne of portsmouth on Rhod-Island by by the act and order of the Counsell of the sayd Towne of portsmouth beareinge date the 20th day of this instant month December apoynted and constituted whole and sole Executrix to the Estate of my sayd Deceased Husband who Dyed intestat Therefore Accordinge to the Law of this Collony I doe by these presents firmly Binde and Ingage my selfe unto Mr. William Baugton of the sayd Towne of portsmouth Asistant et unto his successors in the sum. of fifty one pounds sterll. faithfully and truly to stand to and observe the afore-sayd act and order of the afore-sayd counsell as the will of my deceased Husband - Devideinge his Estate amongst his children And that I will noe waies Directly or indirectly Alianate or imbesell the sayd Estate or in any wise indeavour to act contrary to the afore-sayd act of the Counsell-
